

Range Transitional Housing

In October of 2009, a 19 year old pregnant female approached RTH because she was currently in drug court and she violated her probation because she did not have a stable place to live. If she did not have stable housing within the week, she would be put in jail.

RTH was able to move her into a two-bedroom apartment and furnish it through our Furniture Program. RTH's Case Manager brought her to the County office to sign up for MFIP, Energy Assistance and WIC.

Since the time that she entered RTH's Transitional Housing program, this young lady has worked very hard on all of her goals. She has completed and graduated from drug court, she now has her GED, bought her first car, works full time and is a wonderful mother to her beautiful little girl. She has begun to work on her last goal by starting a savings account and working with AEOA towards purchasing her first home.
