
Hello all,





UWNEMN IRON RANGE PROGRAMS 2019

BUDDY BACKPACKS



One-in-five children in our region struggles with hunger. Teachers and school nurses have shared stories of students returning to school on Monday exhibiting signs of chronic hunger, like stomach cramps, headaches, dizziness, and an inability to focus. Buddy Backpacks was created to provide these children with nutritious, nonperishable, child-friendly meal kits each weekend or break from school.

Children are referred and enrolled by staff. 100% of school staff surveyed in 2019 said they find value in Buddy Backpacks. Survey results show children's health, energy level, attendance, and feelings of being cared for also improved due to their involvement in the 2018-2019 Buddy Backpacks program.

MEET UP AND CHOW DOWN

In 2016, UWNEMN's Board of Directors recognized to expand the organization's food efforts to include a summer program for local children. Piloted in Chisholm its first year, Meet Up and Chow Down has since expanded to include nine different sites in Chisholm, Ely, Hibbing, Mt. Iron, Nashwauk, and Virginia.

Thanks largely to volunteers who helped keep these sites staffed Monday-Thursday throughout the summer, more than 6,000 free summer lunches were served to youth (age 1-18) over the course of summer 2019. Meet Up and Chow Down is sponsored by the Summer Food Service Program of the Minnesota Department of Education and the USDA. *Plans are underway to expand Meet Up and Chow Down to Aurora, Eveleth, and Tower in the summer of 2020.*

SMILES UNITED

Dental disease is the most common chronic childhood illness and accounts for more than 51 million lost hours of school time each year. Through a partnership with UWNEMN and Children's Dental Services, the Smiles United program provides preventive and restorative dental care to uninsured and under-insured children, adults up to age 26, and pregnant women of any age via mobile dental unit. The dental unit could be found in schools across the Iron Range over the past year, and in 2019 the program also expanded to provide service during summer and school breaks at UWNEMN's building in Chisholm.

According to Children's Dental services, 7% of their patients in the UWNEMN service area in 2019 were uninsured, 87% were on public insurance or medical assistance, and 6% had private insurance (most with a very high deductible).

IMAGINATION LIBRARY

Donations to UWNEMN support our organization's sponsorship of the Dolly Parton Imagination Library program. For more than 10 years, our partnership has provided children from birth to age five with a free book in the mail each month to spark their love for reading and increase literacy. Children enrolled in the program at birth will have a home library of 60 books before they enter kindergarten!

UWNEMN also encourages early literacy through "Wild About Reading" - free literacy events throughout our communities designed to bring the Imagination Library to life through activities that celebrate the joy of reading and encourage family participation - and "Read for the Record" which brings volunteer readers into classrooms across our service territory to read stories in hopes of breaking a world record. Thank you to all who volunteer for these literacy events and others - including those who helped hand books out to local children at events throughout the summer of 2019! Thank you also to board members who have helped UWNEMN bring books to children across our region by building Little Free Libraries and Big Blue Bookshelves!

COMFORTS OF HOME

For the Comforts of Home program, UWNEMN has established partnerships with corporate businesses that donate unsold product to be distributed to people in need. Through partnerships with select Bed Bath & Beyond - and **new in 2019, Walmart -** stores, UWNEMN is able to lend a hand and provide household goods to those in need who are referred to our community organization.

In 2019, 818 adults and 371 children benefited from the program locally.

UNITED FOR VETERANS

United for Veterans is the local military initiative created and led by UWNEMN with support from local veterans and service members. The mission of the group is "To create an environment of honor and respect for all fellow comrades in Northeastern Minnesota while developing opportunities, supporting those in need, and empowering veterans.

United for Veterans services include:

- Military Connections Directory (Hero Guide)
- Retreats for families and for female veterans
- Crisis funding
- Emergency packs
- Holiday meal kits for home-bound or in-need veterans
- Transitional home for homeless veterans

In 2019, it was announced that the United for Veterans committee successfully applied for *The Wall That Heals* to be brought to Chisholm in Summer 2020. The exhibit features a three-quarter scale replica of the Vietnam Veterans Memorial and a mobile Education Center featuring a timeline of the war, more information about the Memorial in Washington D.C., and a collection of items that have been left at the wall.

GET INVOLVED

FLAVOR OF THE NORTH

This fabulous food showcase event took place on April 21st at the Range Recreation Civic Center in Eveleth. Local restaurants and food businesses presented their best menu offerings in the categories appetizer, entree, and dessert for a full house. The event raised \$47,397 for the Buddy Backpack program.

FUNSPIEL FOR UNITED WAY

The annual bonspiel was held on December 8th at the Range Recreation and Civic Center in Eveleth. Participants enjoyed a full day that included a light breakfast, lunch, dinner, silent auction, and raffles. The Funspiel raised \$20,183 for the Smiles United program.

POWER OF THE PURSE

On January 31st, more than 200 women gathered at the Mt. Iron Community Center to raise funds and awareness for Imagination Library. This year's theme was "Boots & Bling," and ladies enjoyed fabulous food, silent and live auctions, raffles and more. The event raised \$24,645.

CASH RAFFLES

UWNEMN held two cash raffles in 2019 - one to benefit Buddy Backpacks at the Sawmill which raised \$15,897, and one at Tom & Jerry's to benefit United for Veterans which raised \$16,000.













UWNEMN raises additional funds for our initiatives during the year by holding special events throughout our region. Many people attend, volunteer, participate, or just stop by to watch the fun!

PLANNING FOR THE FUTURE

Since 1966, UWNEMN has been partnering with friends and neighbors to build a legacy of giving in our communities. When investing in our region through United Way, Planned Giving can magnify the power of a gift by joining with others to help solve community needs not only today, but for generations to come.

In 1998, long-time resident Katherine "Katie" Ware left our organization a generous \$411,000 gift upon her passing. The UWNEMN Board of Directors after careful thought regarding how to make the most meaningful impact with her gift, created the "Forever Fund," an endowment to help strengthen families and care for our own in a more permanent way. All gifts to the endowment will remain in tact "forever' with the earnings and interest offsetting the costs of the organization. This allows more of every dollar contributed in the Annual Campaign to go directly to UWNEMN partner agencies and initiatives. Our "Forever Fund" is housed in the Minnesota Foundation.

Each year, a distribution from our "Forever Fund" has been returned to our organization while keeping the principal in tact. Funds are working NOW to strengthen our communities!
